A Note From The Board

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whanau,

The Board currently has several developments on the go:

1. Change in reporting so parents, teachers and the Board can better track progress (in line with our ERO report from 2019).
2. HERO management system for recording achievement, helping track finances and communicating with parents (in line with parental survey feedback).
3. Developing school infrastructure. Over Term 4, summer and into Term 1 next year, the old boiler will be replaced with a pellet burner (in line with our environmental goals - and to avoid a breakdown of the old boiler). The administration block will be modified to accommodate this. We have funding for a new hard surface play area and new verandas. We've fixed up leaky water pipes. We're still working towards building a new school hall within the next 3 years. We also have data with the Ministry of Education in support of our need for new classrooms.

There are many more areas Grant Excell and other staff have been working on such as Positive Behaviour For Learning; revising the school values; enabling a counsellor in the school; extra teacher aide time; collaborating with other schools across our Community of Learning etc.

There is always more we'd like to do than we have resources for but we think the changes above will enhance our students' learning. If you would like to have input in how the school is run, board member elections will be in May next year. We're encouraging you to consider now whether you could contribute as we'd like to allow some overlap of existing trustees with new. If you'd like to find out what is involved you can:


