Principal's Pen


Kia ora Whānau,

FIORDLAND COLLEGE NOTICE

NCEA examinations commence on Monday 6th November. So the College carpark beside the pool will potentially be closed between 8:30am and 5:30pm. Parking could be at a premium so we ask that visitors park on Howden St or McKinnon Loop.

Please also keep noise to a minimum for our students in exams.

Due to some issues with younger members of the community after school the building and court areas are *out of bounds* from 8:30am till 5:30pm.
