In Room 3, we have been busy learning about each other, and more about our own identity over these first two weeks at school. In addition to practising and sharing our pepehas, which let others know the places and people that we have strong connections with, students were also given the task of finding out where their ancestors/tīpuna came from.



In maths, we have been sorting this data and will decide how to best display our findings using different graphing options in Google Sheets. We have been surprised to find out that some of our ancestors have come from countries that we weren't expecting, and for some of us, how many generations back we have to go to find out who was the first of our ancestors to immigrate to New Zealand. It's been a rich and rewarding research!


