Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whanau,

Thanks for helping us move into Level 2 so quickly. Here are some points to remember:

Under Alert Level 2 hand sanitiser will be provided in every classroom. Hand sanitiser stations will be set up at the designated entry and exit points of each classroom. Students and staff will use this hand sanitiser each time they enter the buildings. Students will wash their hands before leaving the classroom, supervised by staff.

Under Alert Level 2 parents and caregivers will be discouraged from coming on site unless absolutely necessary. We do understand however, that some students, especially young ones, will require a parent to drop them off in the classroom. If you do enter our site you must register your name outside a classroom or at the office.

Children, young people and staff should be far enough away from each other so that they are not breathing on or touching each other, coupled with good hygiene practices and regular cleaning of commonly touched surfaces. There does not need to be a specific measurement but where practicable 1 metre should be used as a guide.

Physical education classes and break time activities can include access to sports equipment including playgrounds but hygiene practice should be observed before and after playing with equipment. Drinking fountains will be turned off. Students will need a named drink bottle at school.

Thank you very much for your support during this time. Hopefully we will be back to Level 1 soon.

5 Aside to be played on turf at Fiordland College from 4.00pm

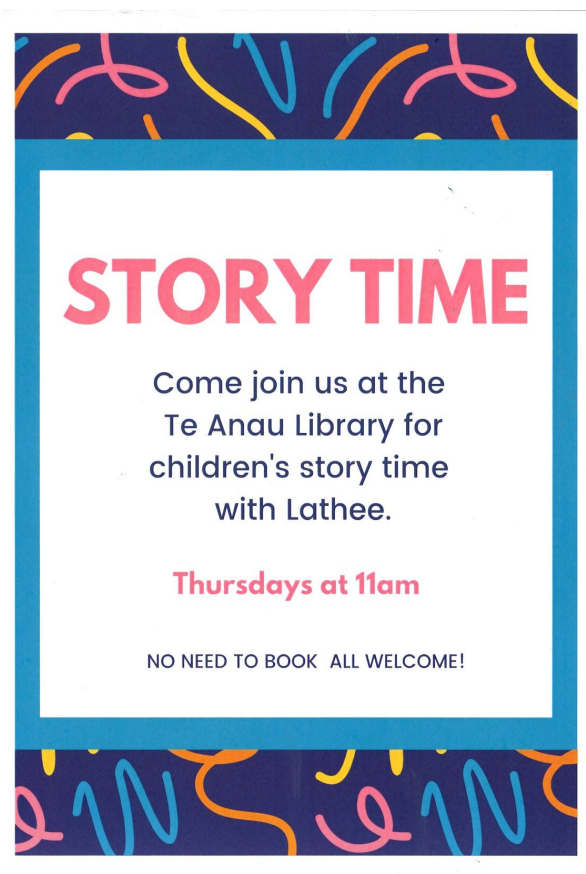
Cost: \$12.00 per player.

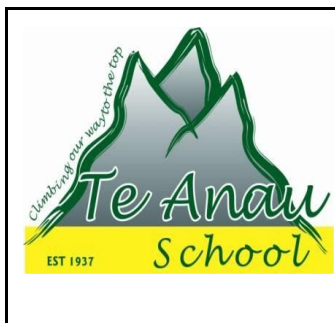
